News, information and advice to help make your area safer

Bedfordshire Police and Bedford & District Neighbourhood Watch want to alert you to a number of recent burglaries in your area.

Since October 2014 there have been a number of burglaries in this area. Most of these were during the day. Most burglaries are committed by opportunists and examples of what they look for include:

Unlocked doors and windows; Signs that indicate no-one is home (no lights on); Windows left open, even small ones; Easy access to the back or side of the house (no side gate or gate unlocked. Low fences); Valuables on view.

Always check doors and windows are secure at all times, even when at home.

We would encourage you to report any suspicious activity.

- Did you see anyone in the street?
- Did something catch your attention?
- Ring 999 if a crime is happening or about to happen.
- Ring 101 if you have information (no matter how small)
- Then tell your local Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator
- Ring 101 for all other calls to the Police

DARK NIGHTS & BURGLARIES

The chance of burglary increases with dark nights. However burglars are less likely to target occupied homes, so make sure your house looks and feels like someone is home at all times.



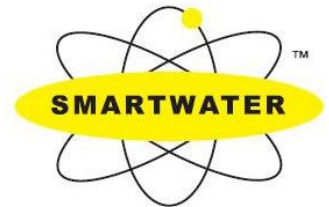
- Fit good quality deadlocks to all exterior doors, including garages and sheds.
- Fit frame locks, especially on ground floor windows and patio doors.
- Don't leave any tools or toys outside the house that could be used to break a window or lever a door.
- Think about where you store your wheelie bins – can they be used as climbing aids?
- Mark or etch your property with your postcode, house number or the first three letters of your house name.
- Register your valuables for free at www.immobilise.com
- Store you house keys and car keys out of sight in your home – never leave them near a door, letterbox or window.
- Consider installing a visible burglar alarm and remember to set it when you go out or to bed at night.
- Prevent easy access to the back and sides of your home by installing lockable gates, two metre minimum fencing or walls. Trellis topping also makes climbing difficult.
- Use automatic time switches to turn on lights and perhaps a radio to make it look like someone's at home, even if you are just going out or a couple of hours.
- Make sure you know the identity of the person you are letting into your home – never open the door if you are in doubt or feel anxious about the caller.
